Objectives:

- Enable participants to share their points of view, their needs, their knowledge and their ideas concerning research with Aboriginal peoples;
- Examine the Chapter 9 of the 2nd edition of the Tri-Council Policy Statement (TCPS2), which focusses on the ethics of research involving Aboriginal peoples in Canada;
- Contribute to the reflection on the addition of a new section, about research with Aboriginal peoples, in UQAT's Ethics Policy for Research Involving Human Subjects;
- Determine concrete ways to respond to principles of research ethics in accordance with the needs and wishes of Aboriginal communities and organizations.
